



## Code of Conduct International Student Mobility

The University of Rome Tor Vergata aims to further improve and strengthen further international co-operation, and it wishes to brand itself abroad as a vehicle to further knowledge society. It therefore strongly believes in International Mobility of Students and Staff and promotes it in the field of the Erasmus Plus program, the Overseas mobility Program, *Ricerca Tesi all'Estero* Program.

I am aware that when I will be abroad I will become part of a community and, by interacting with other people, my actions will affect the well-being of those around me, their productivity as well as their reputation. I am also aware that any wrongful and/or inappropriate behavior might damage the reputation of my University, Tor Vergata in Rome, and reduce the availability of Erasmus and Overseas programs for future generations of Tor Vergata students.

Any of the subjects joining the Tor Vergata Mobility Program (Erasmus Plus – Overseas mobility - *Ricerca Tesi all'Estero* Program) - such as professors, students or administrative personnel - recognizes that his/her own Behavior needs to comply with certain rules of conduct limiting their actions in order for success to be reached, even when such behaviors are not being in breach of the law. Such rules of conduct will increase the possibility of achieving the goals of the Mobility program, along with promoting mutual respect, focusing on attention towards the others and fostering the quality of teaching and learning.

During the mobility in the Host Institution I am aware that I will be considered an "ambassador" of my University, Tor Vergata in Rome. Therefore, by joining a mobility program of my University, Rome Tor Vergata, (Erasmus Plus – Overseas mobility - *Ricerca Tesi all'Estero* Program), it is my firm intention to respect the rules of behavior of the Host Institution where I will stay for the study period. Beyond the respect of local civil and criminal laws, I will avoid – both directly and in written form - the use of terms and tones that might be deemed offensive and/or inopportune towards colleagues, employees, students and third parties with whom they may come into contact. On the other hand, I commit myself to put in place all the actions and behaviors whose purpose is to promote a friendly, comfortable, open work and study environment.
