Entry and Visa Requirements	Generally, students with EU citizenship do not require a visa to enter
	Germany. Citizens of Australia, Israel, Japan, Canada, Korea Republic, New
	Zealand, Switzerland or the USA do not need to apply for a visa in advance,
	but will have to apply for a residence permit at the Immigration and
	Integration Office within three months of arrival.
	Important: some Non-EU nationalities may come to Germany without a
	prior visa application (see link above), but they need to apply for a <u>residence</u>



	permit once they are in Germany (and provide proof of sufficient financial
	resources).
