

- 1) The final exam lasts 2 and half hours.
- 2) It is possible to take only one call for each session (for example it is not possible to sit both of the exam calls in June and July)
- 3) The Mathematics I mid-term remains valid only for the summer call you decide to participate (see point n.2). If you do not pass the exam, the grade you have obtained at the mid-term will be invalidated.
- 4) The grades obtained on the practices in the first semester will be added to the grade of the mid-term; the grade of the practices of the second semester will be included in the final grade of Mathematics II in the exam call you have chosen (see point n.2) If you do not pass the final exam all the practices will be invalidated.
- 5) You have compulsory register on DELPHI in order to participate to the final test. You are allowed to take the exam only if you have an identity card. If you violate one of these rules you will not be accepted to attend the exam.
- 6) During the exam it is not possible to go to the toilet (unless the student has a medical certificate to be delivered largely in advanced before the exam).
- 7) During the exam it is not possible to use calculators or any other devices (tablets, laptops, smartphones etc).
- 8) The exam consists exclusively of a written test (there are no oral parts). The written test is composed by exercises and theory questions (demonstrations or definitions showed during the lectures).
