



Ms. Tania Cooper Patriota (Brazil/USA) served as Deputy Special Representative of the UN Secretary-General and Deputy Head of Mission in Colombia from January 2017 until March 2018.

She previously held positions as UNFPA Representative for Colombia, and Country Director for Venezuela (2010-2014), UNFPA Representative in Haiti (2006-2010), and UNFPA Assistant Representative in Brazil (2003-2006). In Colombia, she worked with the UN system to support the Government of Colombia in the peace negotiations, namely by chairing regional victims' consultations and organizing the first women's peace forum, jointly with UNWOMEN.

She has also worked at the UNFPA HQ Division for Latin America and the Caribbean (1998-2001) and the Division for Arab States and Europe (1996-1998), as well as UNAIDS/Central Asia and Eastern Europe (2002), and more recently as Board and Governance Adviser, UNFPA Division for Governance and Multilateral Affairs, and Officer-in-Charge of the Executive Board Branch (2014-2015).

Prior to joining the UN, Tania worked with the Brazilian Cooperation Agency, Brasilia, Brazil, as project officer; and as psychologist with the Legal Medicine Institute, Geneva, Switzerland.

She holds degrees in Cognitive and Experimental Psychology (University of Geneva, 1978), Numerical Calculus (University of Geneva, Faculty of Sciences, 1985), and a Masters of Public Health, Population and family health (Columbia University, New York).
