

**Costanza Sciubba Caniglia** is a public policy expert and a media analyst, specialized in disinformation studies. She is affiliated with the Shorenstein Center at Harvard and is an editor and co-founder of the Harvard Kennedy School Misinformation Review. She is currently working on Wikipedia's anti-disinformation strategy at the Wikimedia Foundation and launched a research project on information operations in Italy and Europe in collaboration with LUISS University, which received a contribution from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. She writes and consults on disinformation and international relations, including as an Election Observer for OSCE/ODHIR. She previously worked extensively in journalism and public information at the United Nations in New York, including as a spokesperson for Italy on the UN Security Council and as a UN Public Information officer. Her work has been presented at universities, including at Harvard, Columbia, Luiss University of Rome, Michigan University, and discussed on television and radio, including on CNN, Wired, D di Repubblica, La Stampa, and RSI News. She was among D di Repubblica "50 women of the year 2021".
