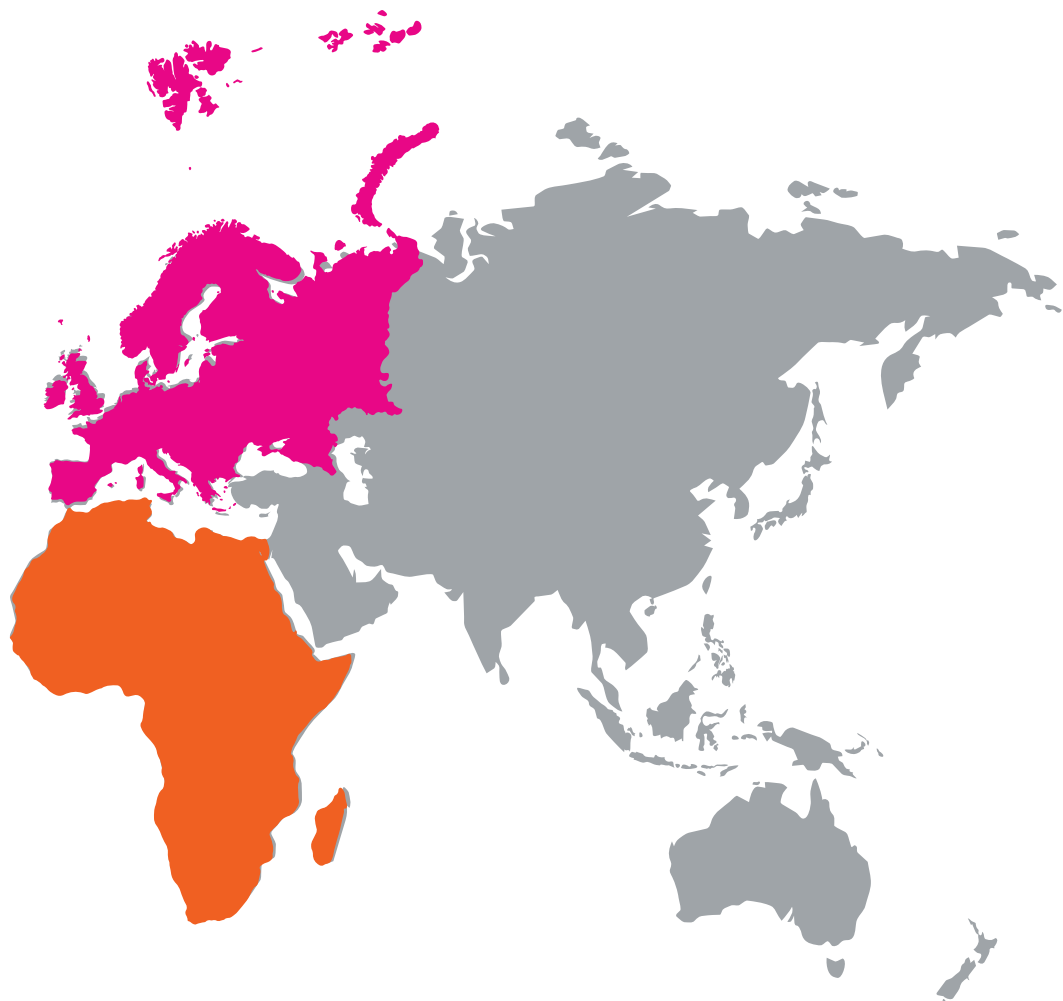

AMERICA LATINA ALTERNATIVA SOCIAL

The ALAS Network was created to bring together the realities that work to promote and provide social and cultural responses to criminal violence, corruption, impunity, and the illegal economy in Latin America. It is composed of over 60 organizations and associations active in Colombia, Ecuador, Mexico, Brazil, Argentina, Guatemala, El Salvador, Nicaragua, Bolivia, Peru, Honduras, and the Dominican Republic. These groups synergistically share methodologies and good practices to spread a culture of peace, legality, and social justice. They operate in the following areas:

- Active remembrance, support for victims and their families
- Political and social impact
- Defence and promotion of human and environmental rights
- Research and Communication

ALAS acts as a coordination and liaison tool for the many organizations working for the dignity and freedom of the peoples of Central and South America. It offers a space, sharing efforts and hopes, tejiendo rutas, that is, weaving common paths, respecting the specificities of each context and organization involved.



ACTIVITIES

ALAS ASSEMBLIES

The Assemblies are regular meetings among the many organizations involved in the network. The First Assembly was held in 2015 in Mexico City. It formally gave life to the Network through the sharing of a "Common Declaration of Intent" that enshrined the principles and strategic areas of action underlying the network's actions. The two following assemblies, in Colombia (2017) and Guatemala (2019), served to define and plan joint actions. They allowed us to recognise the growth of complex but effective international coordination.

INTERNATIONAL MONITORING ACTION

Through the Alas website and its FB page, we report articles, notes, denunciations, communications, and declarations that come to us from ALAS partner organisations. Our aim, as a vigilant and conscientious international community, is to give voice and protection to the many human rights defenders under threat, to oppressed communities, and to criminalised and marginalised organisations.

PUBLICATIONS AND RESEARCH

In synergy with the national Alas networks, we regularly engage in studies and reports at the national and international level on issues and areas of common actions, in addition to the in-depth study of contingency situations such as the Covid-19 pandemic.

PHOTO ALBUM

Every two months, the ALAS Network publishes a photo report of the most relevant events in the various Latin American countries to give an account of the ALAS network organizations' commitment in their respective territories.



GIRAMONDI E ATREVE! MUNDO

Every year, Libera organizes a trip to a different Latin American country, conceived as an experience of both exchange and knowledge - "Giramondi. I Viaggi della Memoria e dell'Impegno", and as a proposal for international training "Atrevete!Mundo." PROJECTS



BIEN RESTITUIDO

FOR DISMANTLING ORGANIZED CRIME ASSETS AND STRENGTHENING CIVIL SOCIETY

In this project financed by the European Union, we engage with Argentine civil society, in synergy with a multidisciplinary group of experts, to promote the approval of legislation on the social use of assets confiscated from organized crime and to accompany the first few actual experiences of re-use.

The *Bien Restituido* project has a duration of 4 years (March 2021 – February 2025) and is funded by the European Union Delegation in Argentina - CSO-LA/2020/421-852 and co-financed by the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs through the Italian-Latin American International Organization IILA.

PROYECTOS EN VUELO

These 30 micro-projects are promoted at the local level by organizations within the ALAS Network on the themes of remembrance, support of victims and their families, prevention of violence among young people, documentation, and political impact, among others.



RED RETOÑO

Project financed by the European Union in Mexico for design and implementation of tools and methodologies for legal and psychosocial support of the families of *desaparición forzada* (Forced Disappearance) victims. At the same time, initiatives have been promoted with political impact and to raise awareness among the civil society, to counter the spread of criminal violence in the country.

FUTUROSCOPIO

Three groups of Mexican (suburban context), Colombian (urban context), and Bolivian (rural context) children build a dialogue by sharing photographs of the places where they live. The photos the children took and shared were collected in a publication and an exhibition, presented on various occasions both in Italy and abroad.

MENORES Y JUSTICIA

A project carried out in Guatemala, El Salvador and Honduras, to contribute to the training of juvenile justice system operators and strengthen the role of civil society in primary, secondary and tertiary prevention courses, in favour of indicted minors.

'Chance' means 'opportunity', and represents the will for resilient action that we want to achieve as a civil society network in Europe;
 'Civil' refers to our being part of an organized and committed community as European citizens and human beings living together;
 'Hub' is a gear, and refers to the idea of a 'hub' through which different actors can collaborate to generate common actions;
 'Against organised Crime,' because only referring to traditional Mafias minimises the dramatic dimension of a complex and increasingly widespread criminal phenomenon.

CHANCE

CIVIL HUB AGAINST ORGANISED CRIME IN EUROPE

The European CHANCE Network was officially presented to the European Parliament in 2019. It is a network of associations, non-governmental organisations, informal groups, and activists who oppose organised crime and corruption as organised civil society intending to promote equality and solidarity in Europe. CHANCE's joint action addresses European and European Union institutions, national governments and European organised civil society. We believe that the fight against corruption and organised crime is transnational and must be tackled first and foremost by strengthening the rule of law.

More than 20 organisations are active in Albania, Belgium, Bulgaria, Denmark, Germany, France, the Netherlands, Malta, Romania, the United Kingdom, Serbia, Spain, and Switzerland, which operate in synergy within the CHANCE network.

The CHANCE network operates in several areas to reinforce:

- social and cultural prevention of crime through education and the fight against mafia stereotypes;
- promotion of public and social re-use of confiscated property;
- pursuit of justice for organised crime's victims,
- anti-corruption measures and civil monitoring,
- transnational and cross-sectoral cooperation with authorities responsible for combating organised crime (Prosecutors, Magistrates, the Police, etc.)

ACTIVITIES

AGENDA POLITICA

Since its first hearing at the European Parliament in 1997, Libera has always believed that repression should be complemented by greater involvement of civil society. This was reaffirmed during the ninth session of the United Nations Convention against Transnational Organized Crime through support measures for reporting and clarity of information, to achieve a solid implementation of the Palermo Convention. This 15-point agenda is the outcome of Libera's collaboration with its partners in the European network CHANCE - Civil Hub Against organised Crime in Europe, officially launched on 3 April 2019, at the European Parliament. It is based on the belief that only synergistic action allows laying the foundations for a more united and secure Europe.



STRATEGIC PLANNING

Building internal debate and joint planning in the medium and long term was key to the construction of the European CHANCE network. The strategic planning implemented in the autumn of 2018 allowed laying the foundations of a shared path, setting real objectives, and structuring future activities by priorities.

EDUCATIONAL BOOKLET

This new training tool, created in collaboration with Libera's Education sector, offers updated educational activities on the topics of anti-mafia and active citizenship to lead the participants of the Italian L2 language courses to a reflection on the global dimension of crime, while identifying some "open" suggestions for debate to develop a European civic awareness. The booklet is divided into teaching units that teachers can integrate into their lesson plans in addition to the teaching material already adopted.



MANIFESTO «FOR A RESILIENT EUROPE»

After the global crisis due to the Covid-19 pandemic, our action must be based on the weaknesses of the current European context, while offering constructive proposals to Member States to focus attention on the main emergency issues, restore the central role of human and civil rights, and contribute to building a closer Europe to citizens. This Manifesto aims to contribute to a long-term vision for the future of Europe by providing a common response to upcoming serious cross-border threats.

REPORT ON GOOD PRACTICES

FOR THE SOCIAL RE-USE OF CONFISCATED PROPERTY IN EUROPE

The report aims to verify the implementation of public and social re-use of confiscated property in Europe, in line with Article 10.3 of European Directive 42/2014, mapping how the European Union Member States (and beyond) have or have not included this opportunity within their national legislation and whether there are actual cases of application. Thanks to Libera's consulting status with the Asset Recovery Offices Platform (ARO Platform), it has been possible over the years to strengthen the Member States' commitment to promoting the social re-use of criminal assets, making the authorities responsible for managing confiscated assets aware of the possibility of actually returning these "assets" to citizens.



INTERNATIONAL EVENTS

With CHANCE network partners, Libera promotes international events involving associations, citizens, experts, and institutional representatives on the various issues that make up the European network's Political Agenda. It is essential to create increasingly open opportunities for debate to discuss "how," not "what," synergy is strategic, continuing to raise civil society's awareness of direct involvement in the construction of a more just Europe. The international COREACT event in Berlin in November 2019 was a unique opportunity for discussion and reflection. Many representatives of associations in Europe shared good practices and new methods of promoting social anti-mafia.

INTERNAL MEETINGS AND TRAINING

In line with strategic planning, the CHANCE network's third pillar is aimed at internal and external training. Thus, it is essential to promote thematic meetings for partners and, at the same time, to promote and participate in external initiatives that support sharing the European path for the promotion of social justice through the involvement of European citizens in the fight against crime and Mafias.

ENHANCING RECOVERY AND INTEGRATION THROUGH NETWORKING, EMPLOYMENT, TRAINING AND PSYCHOLOGICAL SUPPORT FOR WOMEN VICTIMS OF TRAFFICKING

Construction of a comprehensive model for the social and work inclusion of women victims of trafficking into Europe from third countries. This model is built through the development of shared and duplicable tools able to support those working in the sector so that the "treatment" of trauma becomes the opportunity for a more beautiful future thanks to real opportunities.

The project aims to develop an innovative, cross-cutting educational method based on the use of non-formal techniques, to involve and empower young people in the civic fight against corruption at the European level. Through the creation of in-depth materials and specific kits for youth workers, we want to support trainers in promoting the fight against corruption and developing tools and methods for the development of monitoring communities. Strengthening the involvement of civil society organisations in the social re-use of assets confiscated from organised crime is one of the project's central objectives promoted by the OSCE and involves 5 Balkan countries. The training courses and dissemination activities aim to support cooperation between local associations and institutional representatives to create new spaces for dialogue and opportunities for the effective management of criminal assets for social purposes. NO PLACE FOR MAFIA STRUCTURES

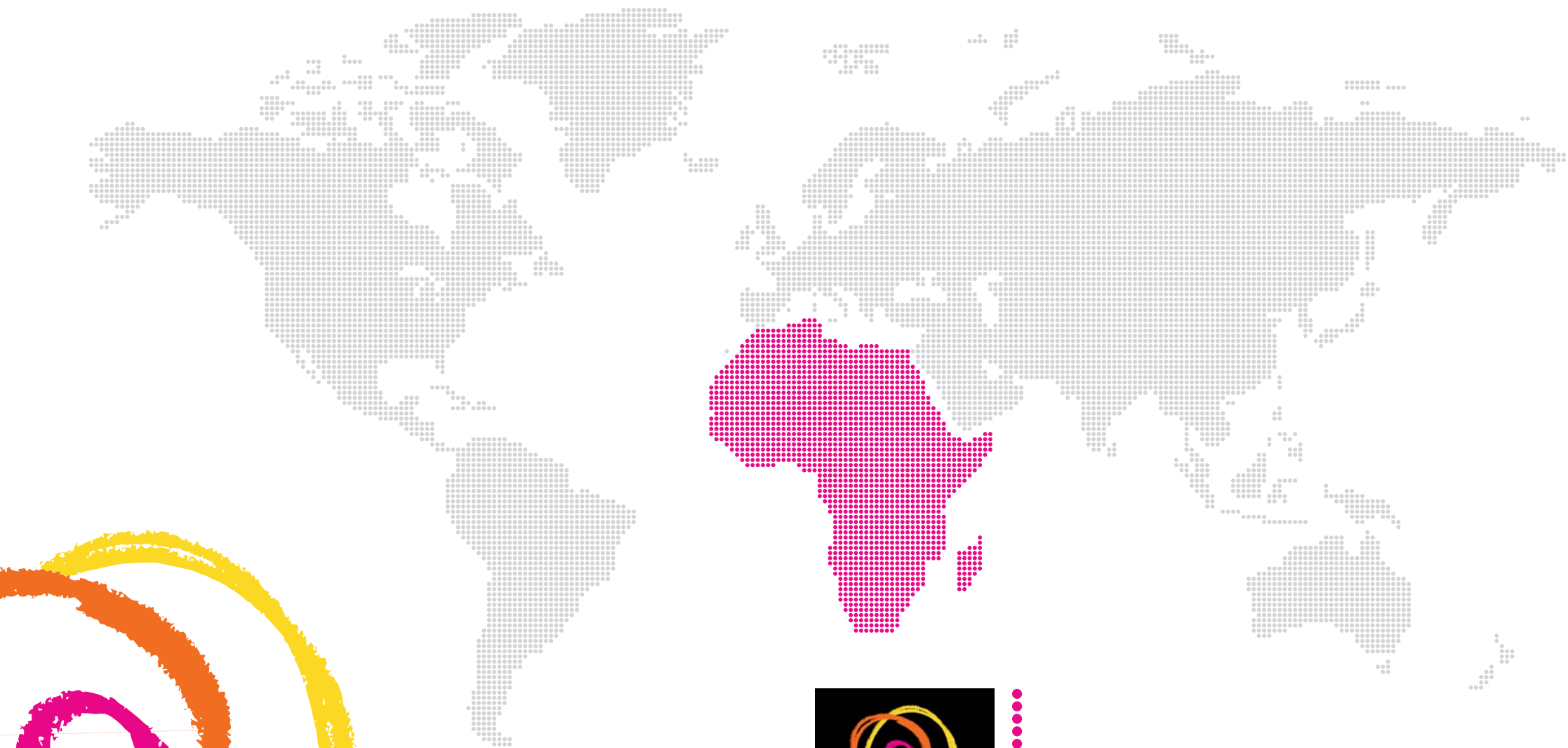

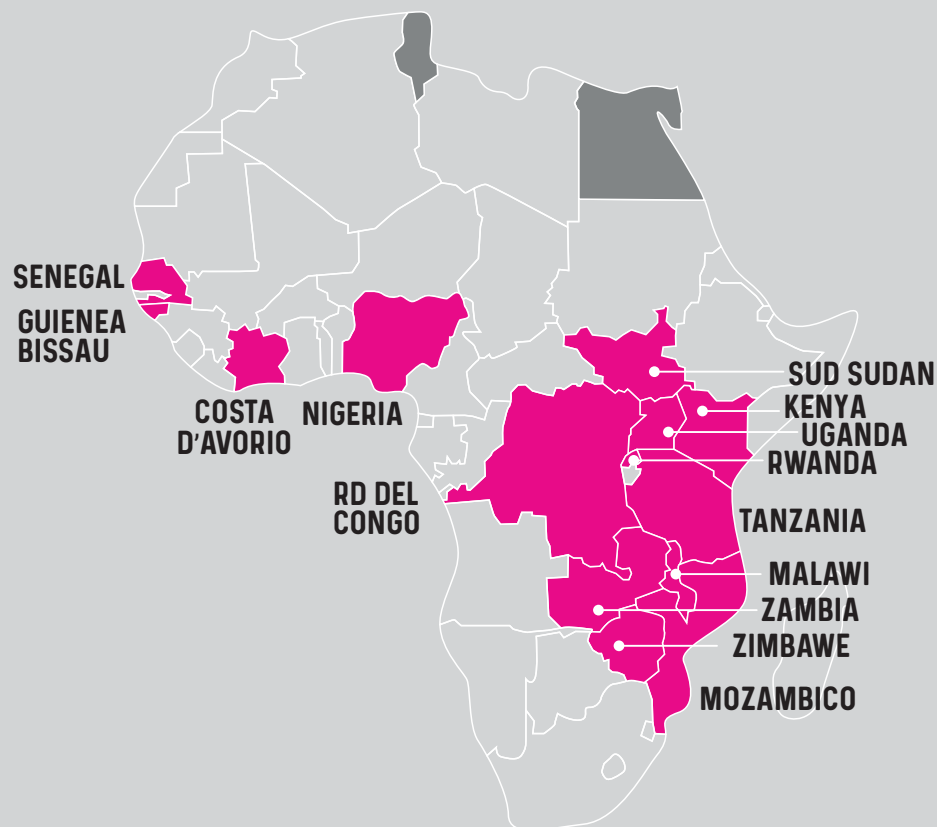
CREATIVITY FOR JUSTICE AND FAIRNESS IN EUROPE

PEACE AND LIBERATION IN AFRICA THROUGH CHANGE AND ENGAGEMENT

Some years ago, Libera decided to take action in Africa, a huge continent that has wide historical, social and economic differences, in which Crime - with more or less evident mafia traits - is constantly growing, in addition to endemic corruption and negative stereotypes dictated by migration and beyond.

At the same time, associations and movements, from local to international action, are dedicated to building possible alternatives to criminal violence and have the skills and ability to tell us the other side of the story of the African continent's peoples.

This path grows with the collective action of realities spread throughout the various regions, with different agendas and priorities, united by the same need for paths of dignity and reconciliation in the promotion of a just and peaceful society.

The goal is to eliminate easy simplifications and stereotypes that too often create a wrong common opinion about what is linked to crime and mafia and what is not.





The goal is to shed light on the protagonists of the daily alternative to criminal violence among peoples that represent the African continent.

Hence, a network was born and is now in its initial phase of defining priorities and mutual knowledge. It had the opportunity to grow despite the Covid-19 pandemic, starting from a common declaration of intent that has as its objective 0 the first among the realities involved.

PLACE Peace and Liberation in Africa through Change and Engagement involves 30 groups active in Sub-Saharan Africa from 14 countries: Ivory Coast, Democratic Republic of Congo, Nigeria, Senegal, Kenya, Rwanda, Uganda, South Sudan, Malawi, Mozambique, Zambia, Tanzania, Guinea-Bissau, Zimbabwe.

The main areas of intervention are:

- Restorative justice, remembrance, and victim support
- Corruption, investigative journalism, and freedom of expression
- Promotion and protection of human rights
- Protection of the environment and ancestral communities as a strategy to combat land grabbing and mining
- Countering trafficking and smuggling
- Prevention in terms of educational, cultural, sports, and artistic paths, all with a gender perspective.

With our partners in the network, we have prepared and approved a declaration of intent, as a preparatory step to holding the network's first assembly.

CAMPAIGNS AND CROSS-CUTTING ACTIVITIES

IN DIFESA DI FOR HUMAN RIGHTS AND THEIR DEFENDERS

This network of over 30 Italian organisations and associations is active on issues such as human rights, the environment, international solidarity, peace and disarmament, workers' rights, press freedom, and the rule of law. "In difesa di" was born to promote campaigns and initiatives aimed at the protection of human rights defenders, to raise public awareness on these issues, and to ask the Italian institutions (Government, Parliament and local authorities) to commit to developing tools and mechanisms to protect human rights defenders.

ITALIAN PEACE AND DISARMAMENT NETWORK

The network was born from the unification of two historical bodies of the Italian peace and disarmament movement: the Rete della Pace (Peace Network - founded in 2014) and the Rete Italiana Disarmo (Italian Disarmament Network - founded in 2004). Both networks have had the support of dozens of Italian associations, organisations, trade unions, and civil society movements since their foundation. They aim to promote the principles of nonviolent action for peace and disarmament through collective action with a comprehensive approach. [LINK](#)





Since 2005, **LIBERA** has enjoyed United Nations Consultative Status, granted by the Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) thanks to which it has been an active and supportive party to the United Nations Convention against Transnational Organized Crime - UNTOC - also known as the Palermo Convention, taking part and monitoring, in particular, the actions promoted by UNODC, the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime

INTERNATIONAL REMEMBRANCE BRIDGES DELEGATION THE FAMILY MEMBERS

From the synergy with the Remembrance sector, a significant exchange and "mutual recognition" has begun between family members of Italian and foreign victims. A common vision, starting from individual pain, is bearing important fruits to exit isolation and acquire a greater awareness that criminal violence strikes everywhere in the world but family members have the tools and resources to find themselves sharing a common commitment to remembrance and justice that goes beyond any boundary.

A shared Mediterranean Memory among Italy, Bosnia, and Tunisia, in the midst of mafias, wars, and desaparecidos and a Latin America in a similar situation has made Remembrance an instrument to counter the crimes and violence that mafia and dictatorships have perpetrated in various ways from Mexico southward. These are movements of victims and family members who tirelessly shout the names of those who have been unjustly killed or kidnapped. Their work is enriched by the Vivi portal, giving space to the biographies of Mafia's innocent victims whose names are remembered every 21 March on the Day of Remembrance and Commitment in Memory of Mafia's Innocent Victims.

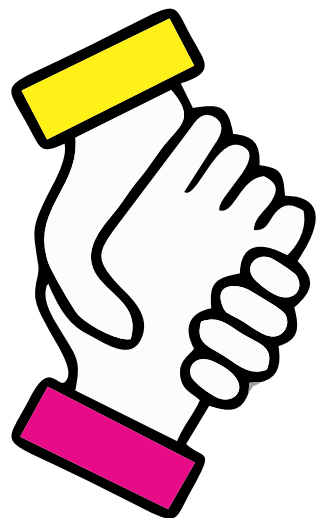
