

Dr. Lara Lázaro Touza is a lecturer in Economic Theory at *Centro de Enseñanza Superior Cardenal Cisneros* (UCM), an Adjunct Professor of Political Economy of Climate Change at IE School of Global and Public Affairs and Senior Analyst at the Elcano Royal Institute. Her research focuses on climate governance, energy transition and oil spills.
