**Short Biographical Note**

Magdalena Ackermann (Argentina) is the Policy and Advocacy Officer on Food Systems, Nutrition and Agroecology of the Society for International Development (SID). She is part of the Coordination Committee of the Civil Society and Indigenous Peoples' Mechanism (CSIPM) for relations to the Committee on World Food Security and co-facilitates the CSM Working Group on Global Food Governance and the Women and Gender Diversities' Working Group. She has also co-facilitated the Working Groups on Food Systems and Nutrition and on Agroecology. Over the past 2 years she has focused on the corporate capture of food systems, particularly through the coordination of the mobilizations against the UN Food Systems Summit.

Before joining SID, she worked for the UN Standing Committee on Nutrition (UNSCN), for the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) and for the International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD) focusing on nutrition and adolescent girls. She graduated in Food Science and Technology at the University of Buenos Aires in 2016. As part of her activism outside of working hours, she is actively engaged in solidarity-based economies initiatives, such as Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) and groups of consumers supporting local, ecological and equitable food production.
