QUESTIONS FOR THE FINAL DEBATE (13 Oct 2023)

Please bear in mind that EGW is a **history** course and that you must answer questions accordingly (that is: do not refer to our present times unless asked so by the question).

- 1) Is Cold War bipolarism the best tool to explain global history after 1945?
- 2) Did the global South provide an alternative to Western capitalism and/or Soviet socialism?
- 3) Which causes led to the emergence of China as an international player from 1945 to 2001?
- 4) How, and to what extent, did the historical memory of WWII affect Japan's role in Asia? (do not necessarily address the 'comfort women' issue)
- 5) What is the legacy of past decades on today's global governance?

Additional questions you may want to also consider while preparing for the debate:

- What place does Europe have in post-WWII global governance?
- Were multilateral organizations (eg. UN, IMF, World Bank) independent from national governments?
