

Chiara Romano Bosch is the Visiting United Nations World Food Programme (WFP) Scholar at Brown University's [Center for Human Rights and Humanitarian Studies](#). Chiara currently works for the WFP headquarters in Rome, Italy; working as a Humanitarian-Military Interaction Officer. In this role, Chiara provides technical oversight and first wave surge support to WFP's operations in order to address potential civil-military coordination gaps and to better enable overall humanitarian access for life-saving WFP responses.
