

Ziya Öniş is Professor of International Political Economy at Koç University in Istanbul. Prior to joining Koç University he was Professor of Economics at Boğaziçi University. He is the former Director of both the Center for Research on Globalization, Peace and Democratic Governance (GLODEM) and the Graduate School of Social Sciences and Humanities at Koç University. His recent research focuses on rising powers and the emerging post-liberal international order, varieties of populism in a global context, democratic backsliding and authoritarian turns in the global South and the European Periphery, domestic politics-foreign policy linkages and new wave of economic crises in emerging powers. His articles have been published in *Review of International Political Economy*, *New Political Economy*, *Global Governance*, *Journal of Democracy*, *Comparative Politics*, *Government and Opposition*, *Development and Change*, *Mediterranean Politics*, *Third World Quarterly*, *Democratization*, *Political Science Quarterly*, *International Affairs* *inter alia*. He is the co-recipient, with Mustafa Kutlay, of the Elizabeth Meehan Prize for the best article published in *Government and Opposition* in 2019. Most recently, in March 2023, he received the Outstanding Academic Achievement Award in the context of 18th Kadir Has Awards.
