

Paul Caruana Galizia became a journalist after his mother was assassinated and since then has won an Orwell Prize special award, a British Journalism Award and other honours for his reporting. With his brothers, he has received a Magnitsky Human Rights Award and an Anderson-Lucas-Norman Award for campaigning to achieve justice for Daphne. Before working in journalism, he completed a PhD in economic history at the London School of Economics and was a Marie-Curie Early-Career Fellow at the Humboldt University of Berlin.
