

Decree N. 73/2016

MASTER OF SCIENCE IN EUROPEAN ECONOMY AND BUSINESS LAW FEE REFUNDS – CALL FOR APPLICATION

The Department of Economics and Finance announces two selections for a total of six tuition fee refunds reserved for EEBL students enrolled in a.y. 2015/2016.

Overall, it's about six refunds distributed as follows:

- three reserved for 1st year students, to the amount of 2.900,00 euros each one;

- three reserved for 2nd year students, to the amount of 2.500,00 euros each one;

The ranking is based on students' performance, as follows:

- a) regarding 1st year students, the refunds are awarded to those students, who have achieved the best performance in the a.y. 2015/2016. The evaluation process is based on exams passed and recorded by September, 17th 2016 (Fall Session closing date), and on any other formative experience gained during the same period;
- b) regarding 2nd year students, the refunds are awarded to those students, who have achieved the best performance in the last two academic years (2014/2015 and 2015/2016). The evaluation process is based on exams passed and recorded by September, 17th 2016 (Fall Session closing date), and on any other formative experience gained during the same period.

In case two or more students are equally qualified, the refund will be awarded to the younger one, for both selections.

Students are required to apply by sending an email at <u>giorgio.berducci@uniroma2.it</u>, and to <u>msc_eebl@economia.uniroma2.it</u> in copy, entering the following heading in the subject field: "EEBL – Application for refunds – First year" or "EEBL – Application for refunds – Second year", depending on the case.

The application form attached has to be filled in by indicating one's own personal data, fiscal code, home address, phone number and email address, CV, the list of passed exams with corresponding credits and marks, as well as any other document considered useful for the evaluation (e.g. language certificates, publications etc.).

In case there are exams not yet recorded on the *Delphi* System, they have to be indicated in the corresponding section of the application form in order to contribute to the average. Regarding this, students are just required to indicate the weighted average showed on their own *Delphi* pages. It's up to the selection board to calculate the overall average by considering the exams not yet recorded on the *Delphi* System and indicated by the student.

The Department reserves the right to verify the exact correspondence between data declared in the application form and those showed on the *Delphi* System, as well as to ask winners for the original documents related to the qualifications declared.

The application has to be send within 30 (thirty) days from the publication of this announcement on the website of the Department. The Head of the Department will nominate a selection board responsible for the evaluation process.
