C. Pedagogical project

In mixed teams of 5 or 6 students (students from each partner university), students will play the serious game called "The Banker".



"What precisely does a bank do? How do you make money with money? Is there a safe manner of banking? In our banking game 'The Banker' the participants experience this at first hand. Banks need a healthy liquid position. Apart from that, they have to make a profit. The bank that is in a position to meet all its payment obligations and, at the same time, make the most profit wins this Serious Game. The banks collect people's savings to keep a positive balance sheet and make a profit. The higher the interest rate, the more money that comes in. They then invest this in assets, such as mortgages, bonds, projects, shares and real estate. But do they consider the duration of the bonds and interest risk? What happens if the savers want to withdraw their savings at the same time? Banks can also borrow money from one another, or even take over another bank. Apart from that, investing (together) in projects can be very lucrative. But what if a project goes bankrupt? The participants assess the risk before they close a deal. Do they play it safe for less money or take the risk and go for the big money?"

6. Funding and scholarships

The project is founded by ERASMUS+ and students from the University of Rome Tor Vergata will have a scholarship to cover the costs related to the short-term physical mobility. All the students enrolled in a master of science or a PhD for the academic year 2022-2023 are eligible for the scholarship.

7. How to reach and what to do in Mons

Mons (also known as Bergen in Flemish) stands on a ridge between the two rivers of Haine and Trouille and is an important junction town between Brussels and Paris. Its origins date back to the seventh century, when a castle was built here, and a monastery dedicated to St. Waltrude was founded here a little later. Mons' heyday was during the 13th and 15th centuries, when it became the capital of the county of Hennegau, but the town suffered considerably during the wars of the 17th and 18th centuries and lost its prominence.

For reaching Mons, you may flight to one of the following airports:

Brussels South Charleroi Airport

Brussels Airport

From Brussel airport and from the Charleroi-Sud (not directly from the airport) you will have a direct train that will stop in Mons.

Train times can be found by checking the national rail timetables at <u>www.belgianrail.be</u>. The centre of Mons is only a short walk from the railway station and the walk should take about 15 minutes. The address of the Mons Station is Boulevard Charles-Quint, 33 - 7000 Mons.

The best places to visit in Mons (Bergen) are:

Mons' City Hall (also called the Hôtel de Ville) presides impressively over the town's Grand Place in the central city, flanked by the ornately-decorated Toison d'Or House (1615) and the Chapel of St. George (1604).

Mons Bell Tower, also known as El Catiau, stands on the former castle hill above the town and is a UNESCO World Heritage site. The 87-meter-high tower was built between 1661 and 1672, designed by Anthony Vincent and Louis Ledoux. It is the only purely Baroque belfry in Belgium, with a carillon of 47 bells.

Church of Sainte-Waudru. Just below Mons' castle hill with the scant remains of the old feudal castle is the Collegiate Church of Sainte-Waudru. Building began in 1450 to plans by

Mattheus de Layens, and despite construction being interrupted several times, the church reveals a remarkable unity of style in Brabant Gothic.

Local History at Mons Memorial Museum (formerly the War Museum) is dedicated to exploring Mons' place in history due to its strategic importance. For anyone interested in Belgian heritage, this museum is one of the top things to do while in town.

Museum Francois Duesberg is dedicated to decorative arts and is home to a collection of items that were popular among French aristocracy during the late 1700s and early 1800sTournai Map - Attractions (Historical)

Every year, during Advent (the period of the four Sundays before Christmas) colorful **Christmas market is held in Grand' Place in Mons**. Thousands of visitors attend the market and enjoy the holiday atmosphere of the place. A giant Christmas tree with colorful lights, Christmas songs that are played all over and booths that sell presents, holiday decorations, sweets, holiday delicates create a magic holiday experience.



For Mons, you can also organize one day trips to Château de Beloeil, Collégiale Saint-Vincent, Beloeil Park, Grand Hornu, Old Town District of Charleroi, Medieval Ramparts of Binche, Parc de Mariemont, La Louvière for Industrial Canal History
