3. Job description: "The effect of in-utero stress on birth outcomes: evidence from earthquakes in Italy"

- The objective of this research project is to study the effect of maternal in-utero stress on birth outcomes. A growing literature suggests that in utero stress can have negative effects on the newborns. However the mechanisms are unknown and in addition it is not possible to measure the level of stress. However, extreme natural events (like earthquakes, hurricanes, floods) are considered an unexpected source of stress but easily measurable. Therefore they can be used to understand the effect of unexpected shocks on birth outcomes. In our project we will use the earthquakes of Aquila in 2009, in Emilia Romagna in 2012, in the Centre of Italy in 2016 to study the effect of interest.
- The intern will be involved in data management on CEDAP data (the universe of birth data in Italy). The intern will be required to acquire familiarity with the data, clean the
