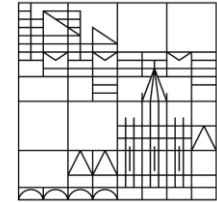

How to apply for second year in TV?	Students will indicate interest in the double degree with TV when they apply to the MSc in Konstanz. If they are admitted to the KN programme, they will – if selected – be informed about their admissions to the double degree with TV
How to apply for second year in KN?	Please contact the director in TV: Prof Daniela Vuri - daniela.vuri@uniroma2.it During the first year of the MSc students are supposed to submit the application to the Call for Dual degree program, usually out in February/March

Tuition Fees at KN and TV	The students will not pay any tuition fees at the University of Konstanz; they will pay the administrative fees only. The students will not pay any tuition fees at TV; they may have to pay for the graduation certificate.
Living costs and Scholarships	Konstanz: Living Costs Scholarships: German students should both apply for Auslandsbafög (has no connection with Inlandsbafög). All students should check in the DAAD Scholarship Database for any individual scholarships they can apply for. The Konstanz International Office webpage has a number of resources , too. TV: The minimum cost of living for a student is approximately € 1000 per month. This includes food and personal care, housing, books, public transport and free time.

	Accommodation: Student House, rooms in private homes, shared apartments with other students. The cost is approximately € 400/500 per month. Metro/ bus card € 35 per month.
Jobs in Konstanz	Many students earn money on the side – it has the added benefit that you immerse yourself in the local culture. Citizens from the EU as well as Malta, Cyprus and the EEA countries (Island, Norway, Liechtenstein) as well as Switzerland can work during the entire year. All other international students (including Croatian students) are permitted to work 120 days or 240 half-days (4-hours / day) per year, if the visa or residence permit do not explicitly forbid it. The Service Centre of the Student Service 'Seezeit Bodensee' provides a job board for students in the entrance area of the university (next to the Campus Café) or on this website .

Seminar in KN

Students are required to take one seminar in Konstanz. You are advised to take it in your first semester in KN. The seminars for the first semester will be announced in June (often 3rd week, and one week ONLY). You will have to choose and register for a seminar **agreed upon with the TV Coordinator**. If you want to finish your Master here with an area of specialization, then your seminar has to be in that area. Students must then go to the individual professor's webpages and follow the application instructions. You will be notified of the registration dates and sent the application form in an email. (Occasionally students may opt to take it in their second semester in KN - please seek advice in this regard. They will always be announced in November.)

Master Thesis at KN

Overall setup

- The thesis in English (30 ECTS) is to be written within a fixed period of 4 months (April – July) and is usually written in the fourth semester. Under exceptional circumstances a one month-extension can be granted – this extension has to be agreed to by both supervisors. The length should not exceed 15,000 words = ~ 50 p.
- The thesis is jointly supervised and marked by **an instructor** from each department at the home and the host university.
- After the application – see below – has been finalized, the topic of the thesis cannot be changed.
- The topic of the thesis is **required** to be discussed and agreed upon with both supervisors; the supervisor at the university where the student spends her/his second year is the primary supervisor and should be the one primarily advising the student (in order to avoid conflicting advice). Students should start discussing the topic with their supervisors towards the end of the third semester.
- At the latest on the last day of the writing period the student is **required** to submit three bound hardcopy versions to the exams office in Konstanz (Room F258). At the same time the student is **required** to send one electronic copy to office.wiwi@uni.kn in Konstanz, and one copy to her/his supervisor at the home university.
- The thesis is jointly marked. The Konstanz professor usually submits a mark and a report to the exams office within 8 weeks; before that s/he should have had contact with the supervisor at the home university and should have either agreed upon a mark, or should have discussed her/his mark with his colleague. The home university supervisor sends her/his mark and the report to the exams office at office.wiwi@uni.kn in Konstanz **within the same period**.
- The student is sent both reports and the final mark **by the end of October**. The final mark is aggregated from the Konstanz mark and the converted mark of the home university, based on the grade conversion table agreed upon and published on the KN double degree website.
- The KN thesis is recognized as an equivalent to the home universities thesis.

Timeline:

Year One: TV students study at TV

Year Two: TV students study in KN

December: Every year, KN and TV communicate about next year's dates.

December/January/February: The students identify KN and TV supervisors and discuss the topic.

February: the students officially submit the dissertation proposal with their final dissertation title to Konstanz (they are given a week within which to register); the form is signed by the KN supervisor and a brief email from the TV supervisor is attached (declaring the role as second supervisor). They also submit their dissertation proposal to the supervisor at TV at the end of February, providing proof of the KN supervisor's consent by handing in the KN proposal form. **Once also the TV supervisor gives the consent, the students are supposed to inform by email the MSc Coordinator and MSc Office in TV of the dissertation proposal with their final dissertation title and the names of both supervisors.**

March: the KN departmental secretary sends a letter to both supervisors with the final title, a timeline and the conversion of marks. The latter assists the supervisors to agree on a mark.

End of March: up 3-4 days before the writing period starts (which always varies slightly to avoid weekends as a submission day), the student receive a snail-mail letter indicating the starting and ending date of the writing period.

April – July: writing period is 4 months.

July/August

1. Student submits two hardcopies and an electronic pdf of their dissertation to office in Konstanz.
2. Student submits electronic pdf to TV supervisor.

An oral defense of the Master Thesis at TV is not required.

September: Supervisors revise the thesis. First supervisor submits proposal to TV second supervisor. KN and TV agree on a mark, or submit their diverging marks. TV sends electronic dissertation feedback to KN. If the marks differ, the average is taken.

October: students are sent the two feedback forms and the mark; on the KN side, the mark is entered into our database, and the final degree certificate is issued. The student sends the final transcript to TV.

End of November/December: KN graduation ceremony.

	<p>Any deviation from the above set-up has to be communicated to all involved at the earliest possible time, and any changes need to be approved by all involved.</p>
<p>Masters Thesis at TV</p>	<p>Overall Setup</p> <p>In order to obtain the Master of Science degree, students are required to discuss their written thesis in front of the examination board, either during the summer graduation session (usually mid July) or during the fall graduation session (usually mid October)</p> <p>To be admitted to the graduation session students must earn all the credit points provided for in the program structure except for those credits of the thesis and must not have any pending financial obligations to University of Tor Vergata.</p> <p>The thesis is worth 24 credit points according to the program structure of the MSc Program. The thesis is evaluated on contents, presentation and defense. The evaluation is expressed out of 110. Students pass the final degree exam if they obtain a mark of at least 66. The Board can unanimously award "lode" (cum laude) as a special distinction.</p> <p>The thesis preparation is divided into the following phases:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Assignment of the thesis • Admission to the graduation session and thesis submission; • Thesis oral presentation and awarding of the graduation grade. <p>Assignment procedures</p> <p>Student is supposed to choose a thesis supervisor, who will supervise the progress of the work. Once the thesis has been officially submitted, the thesis supervisor will nominate, among the professors of the Examination Board, a co-examiner to act as the interlocutor during the defense of the thesis.</p> <p>The student selects and communicates a second supervisor at Konstanz to all involved.</p> <p>Request for admission to the graduation session and Thesis Submission</p> <p>To be admitted to the graduation session students must deliver to the students' secretary about 45 days before the graduation session the following documents: (for example, if the graduation session is on July 16th, all documents should be delivered by June 1st. Click on “vai al login”</p> <p>8 b) for login you are asked username and password, which is already sent to your email, when you register in section 8a .</p> <p>8 c) After login you need to fill out the exact time of your graduation (for example 16/07/2019), then you should click on icon right down “Compila il Questionario”</p> <p>8 d) Now you can choose the language of questionnaire</p> <p>8 e) fill out all pages with patient ;)</p> <p>8 f) When you complete, click to print it or save document on your computer, it’s one of the document you need to hand to students’ secretary.</p> <p>Thesis oral presentation and awarding of the graduation grade The graduation consists in an oral presentation and a discussion which includes answering questions and discussing issues raised by the members of the Examination Board. Then the Board decides the student’s graduation grade. For graduation session, dressing is based on your personal opinion, but overly relaxed appearance is not welcomed.</p>

****Information on specializing in Konstanz in the double degree:**

Students should pay close attention to the information below and seek advice from the University Konstanz advisor. In the case that a student is not able to take the compulsory courses s/he needs in order to specialize (for example if both courses are taught in the summer semester and this would collide with writing the thesis), the director of the Msc Economics is happy to look for alternative courses that will then be compulsory in the specific case!

Area 1: Econometrics and Applied Economics

Compulsory Modules for Majoring (the semesters in brackets refer to KN):

- Applied Time Series Analysis (summer semester)
- Microeconometrics (summer semester)

Both courses are offered in Konstanz and in TV

Area 2: International Financial Economics

Compulsory Modules for Majoring:

- Risk Management (summer semester)
- Portfolio Management (winter semester)

Both courses are offered in Konstanz and in TV - Portfolio Management in KN is called ASSET MANAGEMENT in TV

Area 3: Macroeconomics and International Economics

Compulsory Modules for Majoring:

- Advanced Macroeconomics II (summer semester)
- International Monetary Economics (summer semester)

Both cohorts take Monetary Economics at TV and Adv Macro II at KN

Area 4: Microeconomics and Decision Making

Compulsory Modules for Majoring:

- Advanced Microeconomics II (summer semester)
- Behavioural Economics (winter semester)

KN students should talk to their advisor before looking into this option
TV students take both in KN

Area 5: Public Economics

Compulsory Modules for Majoring:

- Economics of Taxation (summer semester)
- Political Economy (summer semester)

KN students take both courses in KN
TV students should talk to a Konstanz advisor before looking into this option
