Difference with Undergrad

- * In the beginning you'll keep studying for exams (1 or 2 years)
- * Then: The Thesis
- * Altogether different story
- * Not a student anymore, you set your own problem
- * But mind the constraints! (your supervisor)



* Intellectual Curiosity

* Penchant for Math, logical thinking, solving riddles

* Creativity

* Hard work

I said: Think it over

- * Financing grad school is not the problem
- * The problem is commitment and strenght
- * Be prepared: when writing the thesis, time will come when the math won't work and your supervisor will say you paper sucks...
- * Your ideas will be examined down to the smallest detail
- * You'll be tempted to give up: the hell with it

Time as a Phd Student

* 1-2 years of courses (exams)

- * 3-4 years writing PhD thesis (supervisor, presentations to faculty)
- * Job market (January-March last year): cut-throat competition for a job
- * Move on, grow up, get a life!
