### Practical Information for Exchange Students



Choosing where to live while studying is a big decision and it's important to take the time to find out what's available and what would best suit your needs. Based in the heart of Lincoln's city centre, student accommodation at the University is located either on our Brayford Pool Campus or just a short distance away.

Most accommodation at the University of Lincoln is ensuite with a small double bed and shared kitchen. All utility bills and Wi-Fi are included in the weekly fee. Private housing in the city can sometimes be cheaper but, bills will be an additional cost and it may be difficult to find semester-only housing.

For **semester-only students**, each year there are a number of reserved rooms for semester-only students (most UK student housing is rented on full academic year basis). You can find out more by clicking <u>here</u>.

After 31st December 2020, you will need to check if your EHIC card is still valid for use on a short-term study period (exchange) here in the UK (**less than 6 months**). We would recommend *all* students studying in the UK to obtain valid travel and health insurance to cover the duration of your stay.

For exchanges lasting **longer than 6 months**, you will need to pay the immigration health surcharge (£470) as a part of your student visa application.

## Visa Information

Following the UK's withdrawal from the EU **students arriving after 1st January 2021** (EU and Non-EU) must consider visa implications prior to travel under the new 'Points-Based Immigration System':

#### Studying for less than 6 months

This information applies to semester only applicants:

- You will be able to apply for leave under the new 'Visitor route rules'.
- Non-visa nationals can normally seek entry on arrival in the UK and enter via their e-passports.

#### Studying for more than 6 months

This information applies to full academic year applicants:

- You will be able to apply for leave under the new 'Student route' (replacing the existing Tier 4 system).
- An application will cost £348 and you will also have to pay an Immigration Health Surcharge of £470 a year.
- You will need to obtain a 'Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies' (CAS) requirement.

## Nominations & Applications



**1.** Sending Universities should nominate potential exchange students via one of the following routes:

- For Erasmus students via Erasmus mailbox erasmus@lincoln.ac.uk
- For non-Erasmus via Study Abroad mailbox studyabroad@lincoln.ac.uk

2. When the nomination has been formally accepted, the Erasmus+ & Study Abroad office will send the student/partner a link to the University of Lincoln online application form, together with application guidelines.

**3.** You need to provide copies of transcripts and a copy of your passport in the 'Additional Documents' section of the online application form.

**4.** If you have any questions relating to your application, you can email <u>admissions@lincoln.ac.uk</u> (EU Students - where exchange is less than 6 months) intadmissions@lincoln.ac.uk (Non-EU Students + EU Students who require a visa for study). You may be asked to provide additional documentation if something is omitted from the online application form; this should be sent to the respective email address (above).

**5.** The Admissions Department will enter your details into the University management systems for enrolment, induction, timetabling and accommodation, and send an offer letter with a Student ID number.


**6.** You must accept the offer before you can then apply for student housing at the University. *Your Student ID number is used if you are applying for 'on-campus' university student housing.* 

**7.** A module [course] catalogue will be sent to you by the receiving academic School once the offer has been accepted.

## **Getting to** Lincoln

Lincoln's geographical location in the UK means that students have a wide choice of airports within a 2-3 hour radius. Here is a useful guide on how to get to Lincoln from different UK airports by air, rail and road.



#### By Air:

Most exchange students arrive into the UK via Stansted, Manchester or London Heathrow (recommended to proceed by train to Lincoln - see below). Regional airports include East Midlands Airport, Doncaster Sheffield Airport (both airports approx. 1 hour from Lincoln).



#### **By Train:**

Major UK airports are connected by direct train links to Lincoln (some you may need to change). Train travel *can* be expensive in the UK, so it is advisable to book your train tickets well in advance of travel to reduce costs. Tickets can be bought on the day, at the station, or via various apps. Main providers are listed as below:

#### By Road:

Travelling by taxi or car hire from the airport to the University can be a convenient choice for students travelling with a large amount of luggage. For taxis, you may wish to use our local services <u>Direct Cars</u>, <u>Handsome</u> <u>Cabs</u> or <u>Flight Links</u>. Costs will vary depending on the airport you travel from.

#### So you've finally made it to Lincoln! What next?

Once you have arrived in Lincoln and collected your keys from your student housing provider, you will need to formally enrol and collect your student ID card (see next page for instruction) as early as possible, *within the first week of arrival.* We then suggest you:

- 1. Find your nearest food store to get essentials;
- 2. Register with the University Health Centre;
- 3. Meet your Buddy and get to know the campus / Lincoln.

## **Collecting Your** Student ID Card



Tip: your Student ID Card can sometimes get you discount at certain retailers be sure to ask!

Enrolment is the formal process through which you officially join the University. When you enrol, you confirm your agreement to become a student at Lincoln, to abide by University regulations, as well as to having your personal details checked. All students must enrol at the beginning of each year of study.

We have developed an online enrolment approach which will enable you to enrol safely. You can enrol once all other parts of your application are complete and you received a formal offer of study. **An enrolment link will be sent to you approximately 3 weeks before the start date of your course. This will have all the necessary information on how to complete online enrolment.** 

Your student ID card can be collected once you have formally enrolled\* it is recommended that you carry your student ID card when on campus.

Your student ID card will allow you access into certain academic buildings; including the University of Lincoln Library, and laboratories (if specific to your exchange programme). You can also use your student ID card for printing purposes, to log in to a University Printer, simply hold your ID card to the front of the printer, or log in using your University account number and printing PIN (given to you when you enrol). Lost your card? There is a charge of £10 for a replacement ID card.




Already play a sport or looking to try something new? This is a chance for you to check out all out sports teams. You can also find them via the SU website here.



## **Useful Places** To Know

We have compiled a list of useful places we think you should know of during your time here as an exchange student including; supermarkets, pharmacies (also known as chemists), bars, parks, and other points of interest. Please note this is not a full list of places, just a small selection, based on what previous students have asked for.



#### **Morrisons Supermarket**

Here you can find everything you need from fresh and frozen foods, cookware and homeware, toiletries, cleaning products, and much more. Location: 5-10 minute walk from campus Lincoln Shopping Centre, Tritton Rd, Lincoln LN6 7QL



#### **Super Lincs**

Lincoln's largest International & Eastern European supermarket stocking food/drink from around the world; including a fresh in-house bakery and delicatessen counter. Location: 10 minute walk from campus 116 High St, Lincoln LN5 7PR



#### **Convenience Stores**

There are several smaller 'convenience' stores (also known as 'corner shops' in the UK) located just minutes from campus, including specialists international stores stocking halal, Asian foods, and British foods. E.g. Spar and Tesco Express. Location: Several around Lincoln City Centre

Parks and Gardens





#### West & South Common Parks

Both popular spots to take in beautiful views of the city, enjoy a picnic, see wildlife, and just take a breath from the busy city! South Common hosts various events throughout the year. For more information and how to get there, click here. Locations: 15-20 minute walk from campus

#### Hartsholme Park

Covering more than 200 acres, this is a stunning open space to the southwest of the city. Visitors can enjoy socially distant walks and cycle rides through the lakes and ornamental grounds and lots of wildlife watching (taxi, bus or cycle advised). Location: 377 Skellingthorpe Rd, Lincoln LN6 0EY

#### **The Arboretum**

Originally designed and laid out in 1870, this Victorian garden includes lakes, fountains, bridges, and even a maze. To the east of the city, this park is tucked away in between rows of old Victorian houses along Monks Road. Location: 16 Lindum Terrace, Lincoln LN2 5RT

#### **Temple Gardens**

Located in the heart of Lincoln's 'Cultural Quarter', this sculpture park houses the Usher Gallery and The Collection Museum; Lincolnshire's Premier Art Gallery and National Archaeological Museum showcasing Lincolnshire's history. Great for picnics! Location: 1 Danes Terrace, Lincoln LN2 1LP

#### **Lincoln's High Street**

Running approximately 1.3 miles in length, Lincoln's long High Street is home to 300+ shops, bars and restaurants, and is where you will find most of your shopping and recreational needs. Location: 5 minute walk from campus High St, Lincoln LN2 1AP

#### **Independent Shops and Boutiques**

Bailgate is one of the most historic parts of Lincoln's Cathedral Quarter, where independent boutiques, shops and places to eat line cobbled streets. Voted Britain's Best Street in 2012, you can't miss it! Location: 10-15 minute walk from campus Head for the 'uphill' area of Lincoln

#### Waterside Shopping Centre

Situated in the Lincoln's central area of the High Street, here you will find large brand fashion stores, health and beauty stores, food stores, and more. There are more retail parks throughout the city offering further shopping outlets. Location: High St, Lincoln LN2 1AP

#### Traditional Farmers' and Craft Markets

You can enjoy a variety of vibrant outdoor markets in the uphill historic area: including Farmers', Art, and other markets through the year. This is a great place to buy local produce and quirky gifts for you to take home, you won't find anywhere else. Location: Castle Hill, Lincoln (up Steep Hill)





#### **Brayford Pool**

**Campus Bars & Pubs** 

Location: On-Campus

Check out the SU run events.

Located opposite the main campus, The Brayford Pool is England's oldest in-land marina. Here you will find a cinema, several bars (including a rooftop bar with a view) restaurants, and a convenience store. A great place to socialise day or night. Location: Brayford Pool, Lincoln

If you're looking for a relaxing drink with friends, a pub quiz, or something to eat; there are two venues on campus known as Towers (pictured left) and The Swan. Don't forget to take your Student ID Card.





#### City Nightlife

You can find <u>bars and nightclubs</u> hosting events throughout the year. From quiet 'secret' bars, to traditional British pubs, to rooftop bars, to gaming bars, to busy nightclubs - we have it all! Remember to take ID as age is checked at the doors. Locations: High Street/Park Street/Silver Street

#### Eating Out

From Italian to American, Vietnamese to Thai, Greek and Nepalese, Lincoln has a wide variety of restaurants to choose from. We recommend Cosy Club (pictured left), Wetherspoons (for cheap eats), The Rising Cafe (for something quirky), and Bab to Go (for some hearty Korean Street Food).

#### **On-Campus Outlets (FoodLinc)**

The University's main catering outlet is Lindons in the Minerva Building, serving homemade meals, sandwiches and refreshments, and a large seating area. You can also find other places to eat and drink such as Lincoln Pier Cafe (pictured left). Location: On-Campus

#### **Coffee Shops & Tea Rooms**

You can find several coffee shops (such as 200 Degrees pictured left, located in the Cornhill Quarter). We also recommend Coffee Aroma and Coffee by the Arch. Or you can try a traditional Tea Rooms, where you can have '<u>Afternoon Tea</u>' - very British! These are mostly located on Steep Hill.

#### Takeaways & Fast Food

Don't want to cook? There are plenty of takeaway options in Lincoln from pizza, to curry, to kebabs, and much more. You can find international brands such as McDonald's, KFC, Dominos, and several independent takeaway establishments. For delivery, you can use Just Eat, Deliveroo, or Uber Eats.

#### Lincoln Central Train Station

Part of the London Northern Eastern Railway system; Lincoln Central Train Station is located just a few minutes walk from the main campus. Main routes include direct trains to London, Nottingham, Sheffield, Peterborough and Newark (for transit). Location: St Marys Street, Lincoln LN5 7EW

#### **Lincoln Central Bus Station**

Located opposite Lincoln Central Train Station, Lincoln Central Bus Station offers local and regional transport around Lincolnshire, including to the coast (Skegness), up to Lincoln County Hospital, and several traditional market towns (e.g. Horncastle, Market Rasen, Louth, and Grantham).





There are several taxi providers in and around Lincoln providing local, and regional services; however this can be an expensive option if you want to travel far. Typically for a 10-15 minute journey you would expect to pay between £8-10. Prices may vary by company, or during peak times.

The main providers in the city are <u>Handsome Cabs</u> and <u>Direct Cars</u>.

HireBike is a 24-hour, on-street bike share scheme available across Lincoln. If you want to explore the City of Lincoln, or surrounding areas, this scheme is on a pay-per-hour basis starting from £3 for 1 hour. Student discount available. #### Lincoln Cathedral

Lincoln's No.1 tourist attraction can be seen from all around the city and surrounding areas as it dominates the skyline. Built in 1072, it is steeped in history and is a must see! Tip: take your Student ID card to get FREE entry (usually £8 for adults). Location: Minster Yard, Lincoln LN2 1PX

#### Lincoln Castle & Wall Walk

Home to one of the original 1215 copies of the Magna Carta, <u>Lincoln Castle</u> is a beautiful example of a medieval fortress and a great place to explore, sit and relax, or enjoy a picnic. We recommend you do the 'Wall Walk' for beautiful views over the city. Location: Castle Hill, Lincoln LN1 3AA

#### **Steep Hill**

Being the fourth steepest hill in England - you will need a rest when you reach the top (but it's worth it!). Voted Britain's Best Street in 2012, it is full of old charm with history dating back to Roman times, which you must see during your time in Lincoln. Location: Steep Hill, Lincoln

#### **Doddington Hall & Gardens**

On the outskirts of Lincoln, this Elizabethan Hall & gardens are great to walk around its five acres of gardens, relax, and maybe do some shopping too. Here you will find a farm shop and cafe. It is accessible via a short taxi ride, or by car hire. Location: Main St, Doddington, Lincoln LN6 4RU

#### **Museum of Lincolnshire Life**

Lincoln has a rich and varied history, the museum celebrates the culture of Lincolnshire and its people from 1750 to the present day. Exhibits illustrate commercial, domestic, agricultural, industrial and community life. Entry to the museum is FREE. Location: Burton Rd, Lincoln LN1 3LY

#### **The Collection & Usher Gallery**

Award-winning archaeology museum located in the heart of historic Lincoln, with interactive exhibitions, events and talks, and guided tours. Learn about Lincoln's ancient history and earliest inhabitants, or go across the road to the <u>Usher Art Gallery</u>. Location: 1 Danes Terrace, Lincoln LN2 1LP

#### **The Natural World Centre**

The Natural World Centre is set in the heart of the beautiful <u>Whisby Nature Park</u>. Here you will find various walks, wildlife, and nice views over the lakes. It is a short taxi ride away, or bus routes 48 and 49 from Lincoln Central Bus Station will get you close. Location: Thorpe on the Hill, Lincoln LN6 9BW

#### **Mansions of the Future & Art Spaces**

<u>Mansions of the Future</u> is a three year arts and cultural hub in Lincoln brought to life through a public programme of talks, exhibitions and workshops. This is just one of the many <u>arts and</u> <u>cultural spaces</u> in Lincoln. Location: St Mary's Street, Lincoln LN5 7EQ

#### **Cinemas & Theatres**

There are 3 cinemas in Lincoln (<u>Odeon</u>, <u>The Venue</u>, and <u>Everyman</u> - pictured left). They cater for different budgets and show different types of films. There are 2 main theatres (<u>LPAC</u> - which is our oncampus theatre, and The <u>New Theatre Royal</u>) hosting a range of different shows.

#### **Boat Trips along the Fossdyke Canal**

As Lincoln is situated on the England's oldest inland marina, we recommend you take a boat trip on of the canals through the Lincolnshire countryside. The most popular boat trip is called <u>The Brayford</u> <u>Belle</u> which can be boarded at the Brayford Pool. A smaller boat trip called the 'Oliver Boat' also runs.

#### **City Tours**

As you may only be here for a short amount of time, we recommend you see as much of the city as possible. <u>The Lincoln Bus Tour</u> is an open top sightseeing tour of the city with live commentary, or there are several walking, and photowalk tours that can be booked. We organise one during welcome week.







#### Lincoln Christmas Market

Opened in 1982, it is the <u>oldest Christmas Market</u> in the UK, brought here by our friendship and twinning with the town of Neustadt-an-der-Weinstrasse in Germany. Here you will find food, drinks, gifts and much more! Location: Bailgate, Lincoln (Cathedral and Castle)

#### The Countryside

Lincolnshire is the UK's second-largest county, so there is plenty of unspoilt countryside to visit. Made up of farmland, rolling hills and traditional market towns, the <u>Lincolnshire Wolds</u> is known as an 'Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty'. We suggest regional trains, buses, or car hire to get around.

#### The Coast & Walks along the Beach

If you want to visit <u>traditional British seaside towns</u> and unspoilt coastline, then you're in the right place. <u>Visit Skegness</u> for fun in the arcades and amusement park, or for something quieter, see baby seal pups every November/December at <u>Donna Nook Nature Reserve</u>. Bring warm clothes!





# **Connecting** to WiFi



#### When on-campus and in university student-housing:

The University provides free unlimited Wi-Fi across campus and in the student halls (university housing).

- 1. To get started, go to the Wi-Fi settings on your device and select the "eduroam" network.
- Next, enter your username in the following format. 01234567@students.lincoln.ac.uk (where "01234567" is your student ID)
- 3. Enter your password. If your device asks you to trust the network, allow this. If you are using an older device, our ICT may have to install some security certificates for you.

Once the device has connected, it will automatically log in to the network whenever you are on campus.

#### In privately rented student-housing:

You will need to contact your housing provider/landlord for further instruction.

#### FREE City of Lincoln WiFi:

When out in the city, you can enjoy <u>free WiFi access</u> provided by Lincoln City Council and Lincoln BIG. Please use the instructions below to connect:

- 1. Open your WiFi settings;
- 2. Select "COLin City of Lincoln WiFi";
- 3. Click to read the terms and conditions;
- 4. Tick the box to accept terms.

*Alternatively, many restaurants, cafes and coffee shops will provide free WiFi access whilst on their premises.*


