

Nomination and Application Procedure



Online Nomination

- ▶ Exchange coordinators at partner institutions are responsible for nominating selected students through the Mobility-Online platform.
- ▶ A link to the nomination platform will be provided to exchange coordinators before the nomination period begins.

Nomination Deadlines:

Fall semester/Full Academic

Year:

April 1 – April 20

Spring semester:

October 1 – October 20

Online Student Registration

- ▶ Upon nomination, exchange students will receive an email with instructions and login details for the **Mobility-Online** platform. Students must complete their online registration by entering personal information and uploading their language certificate.

Language Requirement:

A minimum of **CEFR B2** level English proficiency is required. Accepted certificates include a valid **CEFR B2** language certificate or one issued by the student's home university. Native English speakers are exempt from submitting a language certificate.

Registration deadlines:

Fall semester of Full Academic Year: **May 5**

Spring semester: **November 5**

Please note that course registration operates on a **first-come, first-served basis**. Therefore, students are advised to complete the registration process as early as possible once access is granted.

Corvinus is right on the banks of the Danube river, offering the best of both worlds: a stunning historic building as well as newly built, state-of-the-art facilities nearby.




Budapest, one of the best student cities in Europe
