Accommodation	Average cost for a double room with private bathroom is 239 € per month (the cost for electricity & water are included in the price). The cost for staying the whole academic year is 179 € per month.
	Non-EU and EU students staying longer than 90 days must apply for the Temporary Residence Permit at the Dubrovnik police station upon their arrival.

	When applying for temporary stay for the first time, students who are non-EU citizens need to enclose proof that they have not been convicted by a final ruling of any criminal offences in their home country or a country where they resided for more than one year immediately prior to arriving in the Republic of Croatia (the so called "No criminal record certificate" – document in English language). If there is no bilateral or multilateral agreement between the Republic of Croatia and the student's country (and the student's country is not a signatory to the Hague Convention Abolishing the Requirement of Legalization for Foreign Public Documents), public documents such as the No criminal record certificate, can be used in the Republic of Croatia only if they have been legalized by apostille. The process of legalizing the certificate by apostille can take time, therefore we advise students to initiate the process at least a couple of months before arrival to Croatia. The No Criminal Record certificate needs to be in English or translated into Croatian (translation cost paid by student).
Living costs	The official currency of the Republic of Croatia is EUR. Average living costs for a student in Dubrovnik are between 400 € and 660 € , depending on the accommodation costs and personal expenses.
Language of instructions	The official language of instructions at UNIDU is Croatian, but at each department there's a group of courses that can be taught in English. The actual performance depends on the number of interested student to attend the specific course.
