Within the EEAS, MD CROC is responsible for 70 staff and 3 services

1) Situation Room – service operating 24/7 monitoring crisis and emergency situations all over the world- preparing data and information in real time to the High Representative, the Secretary general and all the political and technical management within the EEAS and other Commission services. The SITROOM is connected with all the Member states SITROOM, similar UN and other States services.

2) Consular services: monitoring any possible emergency regarding the European citizen living, working and travelling in third countries. Coordinate the assistance in case of emergency through a permanent connection with the 28 Member states

3) Staff operating 24/7 for planning, managing and coordinating response in case of emergency. Responsible for the organization of the “Crisis Platform”, coordination body to be convened in case of major crisis. The Crisis Platform gathers all the EEAS Departments concerned with the specific crisis, and other EU Commission Services (DG ECHO, DG DEVCO, DG HOME etc.) is coordinated by the High Representative or, in her absence, by the Secretary General or MD CROC.

During the mandate MD CROC has followed, among other competencies, major international crisis, carrying out field missions to: Libya, Egypt, Syria, Turkey, Tunisia, Ivory Coast, Mali, Central African Republic, Kenya, Somalia, Sudan, Philippines Myanmar, Georgia and the Ebola affected countries.

Upon request by the Arab League Secretary General and the Presidency of Myanmar has followed the creation of a Situation Room in the Arab League Headquarters in Cairo and Naypyidaw. Has worked on the reorganization and strengthening of the SITROOM located in the ASEAN Headquarters in Jakarta, and the Crisis room of the OAS in Washington.

Has worked intensively with UN Agencies WB, ICRC and IOM on crisis management.
