1. The Bachelor of Arts in Global Governance – *as you can see from our Courses described in the booklet* - offers interdisciplinary teaching, which aims to prepare professionals to face global challenges that require specific legal and socio-economic competencies, as well as a wide range of technical and scientific knowledge and soft skills to manage cultural integration, mediation and team dynamics. Do you have similar Bachelor's programs at your University? What is your personal opinion about such type of (Liberal Arts and Sciences) programs?

First of all, these types of disciplines are all that I have dreamt of, even when I was studying in Sienna, History of Art, combined with Cinema and Theater, there was this aim of arriving to a wider spectrum via merging other disciplines. In an era of hyper specifications of qualifications and competencies, it is important to confront different kind of problems through a interdisciplinary perspectives. My department, Digital Art department, is trying to combine other fields of arts through merging different studying units.



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2. One of the main goals of the 3-year B.A. in Global Governance is to support the academic education of our students with a series of professional trainings so as to better identify their potential work opportunities after they graduate. For this reason, Global Governance encourages training programs and internships within institutions, firms and organizations, both in Italy and abroad, selected on the basis of their prestige and quality of the experience. Do you think that these activities are important for the placement of our students in a University/Master program like yours or is it too early to do them during a Bachelor?

Internships are always precious tool for combining the theory and practice. Practice usually supports the theoretical knowledge acquired during one's studies which is essentially for a better understanding of the subject matter and bridging one competency to another. The earlier this presentation comes it is the better. It is not to say that the practical part needs to overpower the theoretical part because theory is essential in the field of education. The contact with the real world is very important.

3. Global Governance is implementing the so-called "Mentors Project". The main purpose of the project is to provide advice to students regarding choices on future studies and/or careers by putting them in touch (throughout the duration of the course) with a professional for advice and counsel. Does your University/program use Mentors or something similar to enrich your students' knowledge of the world? If so, are they effective?

Malta is within the Commonwealth system of education therefore the function of a mentor or a supervisor important but usually they appear within the thesis writing phase. What we do is to organize a study unit, where the guests come and present their works to students one-to-one. Encouraging some attitudes by involving work scene, to create that kind of connection. In this, Malta being a small island plays a big cultural factor since it is a very small island, small population low number and of students.

In order to help our students select an appropriate academic pathway to follow after they have completed the B.A. in Global Governance, the course offers three majors to choose from: Economics and Philosophy; Political Science, Law and History; Science and Technology. Do you think it is advisable to offer majors, or in other words, subject areas that students specialize in, in a Bachelor Degree? Would you give a greater attention to a candidate from one of those three paths or would you look only at other dimensions of their Bachelor studies? In case yes, which one of the 3 majors?

It is clear that it is impossible to conceive art without a clear understanding of the context. A person that is coming from a major that is involved in Political Science major would be a perfect fit for our__artistic world. Bachelor students coming you're your course would be perfect fit for our program.
