at the DEPARTMENT of ECONOMICS and FINANCE
in ACADEMIC YEAR 2026/2027, FALL TERM

-decision of the Board of the Department taken on May 11, 2026-

The Department of Economics and Finance of Tor Vergata University of Rome invites distinguished professors, preferably from a foreign University, to apply for a visiting position.

The purpose of the Visiting Professorship Program (ViPP) is to raise the University's international profile through the development of teaching and research cooperation.

The Department of Economics and Finance welcomes applications for **3 Visiting positions**, in the Fall term 2026 of the A.Y. 2026/27.

Visiting Professors: activity and period

Visiting professors are expected to carry out research activities in cooperation with students, researchers, and professors of the Tor Vergata academic community.

The visitors are expected to spend *at least two weeks* at Tor Vergata University of Rome, and give seminars for *at least 6 hours* during the whole visiting period. The Department will award an all-inclusive maintenance grant of 4.000,00 euros as gross amount. Any additional costs will be covered by the visitors themselves.

Applicants are required to formulate a teaching proposal for a series of seminars at the doctoral level, and to indicate in the application the favorite visiting period within the academic year 2026/2027, in Fall 2026 (**September – December 2026**).

Interested professors are asked to send the application to visiting@def.uniroma2.it along with an updated CV, the teaching proposal for the PhD series of seminars, and Annex A for the acknowledgment of the privacy policy ("Privacy Policy Disclosure_n9_Selection and management of contracts").

In case no applications are submitted or are considered as suitable, the Selection Committee can decide to assign the amount of the vacant positions to increase the number of positions available for the Spring term 2027, A.Y. 2026/27.

Timeline

The deadline for application is **June 30th, 2026, 12:00 p.m.** (Central European Time).

Selection

The available positions are assigned through a competitive selection procedure, carried out by a Selection Committee appointed by the Department of Economics and Finance.

Duration of the data storage	<p>The personal data collected will be retained for a period of time not exceeding the achievement of the purposes for which they are processed ("principle of storage limitation", pursuant to Article 5 of the GDPR).</p> <p>The personal data collected will be retained under the following terms:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- the personal data of the subjects participating in the comparative procedure, where applicable, and not winners will be retained for the time necessary to complete the selection procedure;- the data of internal personnel in charge of training courses will be retained for one year from the termination of the assignment itself;- the data of external personnel contained in the request for authorization to carry out the assignment and in the communication of the compensation paid will be retained for a period of five years from the termination of the assignment;- the data relating to the rankings, minutes and authorization provisions for the assignment will be retained for an unlimited period, as established by the archiving obligations imposed by the current legislation and as provided for in the Summary and the attached University Selection Handbook.
7. Rights of the interested party	The interested party has the right to obtain from the Data Controller, (by writing to privacy@uniroma2.it) access, rectification, erasure of personal data, as well as the right to limitation, portability of data and opposition to the processing that concerns him/her (articles 15-21 of the GDPR). The interested party has the right to lodge a complaint with the Guarantor for the Protection of Personal Data (protocollo@gpdp.it or protocollo@pec.gpdp.it) (article 77 of the GDPR).
8. Obligation to provide data	<p>The provision of data is necessary for the purposes of evaluating the requirements for participation in the selection procedure, under penalty of exclusion from the same.</p> <p>The provision of data is a necessary requirement in order to allow authorized university personnel to present the documentation useful for issuing the aforementioned authorization and for activating the procedure for family reunification/entry of accompanying family members, for the assignment of the aforementioned assignment and/or for the transfer of copyright relating to the work possibly produced.</p> <p>Consequently, any refusal will preclude the implementation of the aforementioned activities.</p>
9. Ways of processing data	The personal data provided will be subject to processing operations in compliance with the aforementioned legislation and the confidentiality obligations that inspire the activity of the Data Controller. The data will be processed both with computer tools and on paper and on any other type of suitable support, in compliance with the appropriate security measures pursuant to Article 5, paragraph 1, letter f) of the GDPR.
